STORMONT WILL NEVER DELIVER!

INLA opposition vindicated

Way back during the shifting political sands of 1998, both the IRSP and INLA when asked to endorse Stormont and the Good Friday Agreement; refused to do so, standing squarely on the Republican Socialist principle that there can be no sectarian road to Irish Freedom and no parliamentary road to Socialism. During the 'Good Friday' referendum the IRSP faced scorn; openly campaigning for a 'No' Vote on the grounds that a new Stormont would deliver nothing but dividends for the rich and corrupt, and a sectarian playground for unionist supremacists, continued British oppression and NO prospect of Irish Unity. **INLA ceasefire!** While respecting the opinion of the Republican base who overwhelmingly wished for an end to armed actions, the INLA warned that Sinn Féin was heading into a political Cul-de-sac. Gino Gallagher had stated such as early as 1994 and called for the advancement of a Republican alternative. **IRSM Vindicated!** Recent developments in Stormont have exposed it as indeed little more than an irreformable cesspit of inequity and perpetual roadblock to equality and Irish Unity. Sinn Féin and the DUP will no doubt cobble together some undignified compromise in the coming seasons, however it is becoming increasingly clear to Working Class Republicans that there is nothing in there for them. That realisation will only increase when the corrupt institutions re-appear. **What's your Alternative?** Slowly, gradually, yet undeniably, the opposition of the IRSP and INLA towards the Good Friday Agreement, the revival of Stormont, and making peace with partition and capitalism is being *vindicated*. The IRSP need no longer blush at the short comings of their own efforts, the dying debacle which is the Stormont experiment; complete with **Tory Cuts, Sectarian Pantomime, industrial criminality and continued MI5/PSNI oppression** puts the shortcomings of all dissenters in the shade. As Stormont's political party's prepare to engage in an entirely sectarian and futile election campaign, the IRSP stand firm upon our undiluted program of National Liberation and Socialism for Ireland. The advancement of the Republican alternative which Gino Gallagher called for. Ours is a less populated place for now, but an immensely more dignified space for sure.
